Program Costs

Graduate tuition and fees at the University of Florida for 2011-2012 are \$498.09 per credit hour for Florida residents and \$1,222.81 for non-residents. Each student accepted for admission into the counseling psychology doctoral training program is accepted as a departmental teaching assistant, a departmental research assistant, or as a Fellow of the University. Annual funding for these positions ranges from \$14,000 to \$19,000, depending on the position, as well as remission of tuition for 9 credit hours (12 for Fellows) both Fall Semester and Spring Semester of the academic year. Fellows also receive remission of tuition for 6 credit hours of Summer Semester tuition. Students pay their own fees and pay tuition costs beyond those covered as an assistant or Fellow. For 2011-2012, Florida resident fees are \$70.72 per credit hour and nonresident fees are \$690.21 per credit hour. Fees for tuition covered as part of being a departmental assistant or University Fellow are charged the Florida-resident rate. Students in good standing receive up to 5 years of funding and tuition remission, contingent on budget availability.

Licensure

Number and percentage of students who graduated from the program between 2001-2009 who obtained licensure: 30 out 47 (63.82%). Because the program embraces the scientist-practitioner training model, many program graduates pursue academic positions and other positions that do not require licensure.
